WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP FOR YOUNG EVENTING HORSES OCTOBER 17-20, 2024

The Mondial du Lion is the ultimate gathering for the brightest emerging talents in eventing. There is only one World Championship for these future stars, and for 39 years, the beautiful Isle Briand Park in Le Lion-d'Angers has been its iconic setting. The World Championship for 6- and 7-year-old horses is the first step on the path to the highest levels of international competition for young horses. This is why the world's top riders make it a point to start their most promising recruits here. For instance, CHIPMUNK FRH, who won Olympic gold in Paris with his German rider Michael Jung, competed at the Mondial as a 7-year-old, as did SHADOW MAN, silver medalist at the recent Olympics with Australian Christopher Burton!

Over the four days, the Isle Briand Park transforms into an open-air stage, accessible to all and filled with sport, conviviality, and festivity. The Mondial du Lion uniquely combines top-level competition with a warm, welcoming atmosphere, drawing 45,000 spectators each year. From October 17 to 20, 2024, the most talented international equestrians will come together to experience the family-friendly and lively ambiance that defines the Mondial du Lion.

However, at the Mondial du Lion, the real stars are the horses! It is they who will compete for the title of World Champion among 6- and 7-year-olds—a crucial first step towards reaching the pinnacle of the sport.

LE LION, IT MUST BE EARNED!

The Mondial du Lion gathers the finest 6- and 7-year-old horses of their generation. To ensure the safety and well-being of both equine and human athletes, riders and their horses must meet specific performance standards before being allowed to compete.

QUALIFICATION CRITERIA:

6-Year-Old Horses: Must have completed a Two-Star cross-country course without obstacle penalties* and with no more than one fault (4 points) in the show jumping test. These criteria must be met between January 1, 2023, and September 17, 2024.

7-Year-Old Horses: Must have completed both a Two-Star and a Three-Star cross-country course without obstacle penalties* and with no more than one fault (4 points) in the show jumping test. These criteria must be met between January 1 and September 17, 2024.

Following qualification, the horses' participation at the Mondial **is determined by their national federation,** with national selectors responsible for the final selection. For France, this responsibility lies with Thierry Touzaint.

Each country has a quota of 15 places: three for 6-year-olds and twelve for 7-year-olds.

Each rider is allowed to compete with a maximum of two horses: either two horses in the same championship or one horse in each of the 6- and 7-year-old categories.

*Errors such as the activation of a safety device on a cross-country obstacle or a narrowly missed flag are tolerated..

GOING FOR THE DOUBLE!

Barrington Alice, the beautiful grey mare crowned World Champion in the 6-Year-Old category in 2023 with her British rider Isabelle "Izzy" Taylor, will be competing this year in the 7-Year-Old Championship! **Hermès du Gévaudan**, who finished second last year with French rider Stéphane Landois, is also on the start list.



REMINDER

WHAT IS EVENTING?

Eventing is an equestrian triathlon where horse and rider teams compete in three tests: Dressage: Riders perform a predetermined sequence of movements at various paces (walk, trot, and canter), which are scored by judges based on precision and fluidity.

Cross-Country: A timed course set in natural surroundings, featuring natural obstacles like logs and water crossings that must be jumped.

Show Jumping: Usually the final phase (though in some events it can precede the cross-country). Horses jump obstacles arranged in an arena, with penalty points for any knocked rails.

The final score is the total of points earned across all three phases.

The day after the cross-country phase, horses undergo a "final inspection" before the judges. Riders walk and trot their horses in front of officials, who assess their soundness. Any horse showing signs of discomfort, such as lameness, is withdrawn from the competition.

Historically, **eventing** was practiced by military riders to train and test their horses. The dressage phase showcased obedience and maneuverability, the cross-country phase tested bravery, and the show jumping phase demonstrated recovery and athleticism.





THE 2024 CROSS-COUNTRY COURSE FEATURING TWO OBSTACLES FROM THE OLYMPIC GAMES

A true hallmark of the Mondial du Lion, the cross-country course is renowned for its iconic obstacles that captivate thousands of fans and curious onlookers each year. Famous jumps like the Owl, the Spider, the Phoenix, and the Trumpet have become legendary challenges.

For the 2024 edition, the cross-country course once again features the work of Christian Aschard, the creative mind behind the event's signature obstacles. This year, two spectacular jumps created for the Paris 2024 Olympics will be part of the course. Named "The Builders" and "The Stag," these additions promise to bring extra excitement and challenge for the competitors, making the course even more thrilling to watch.

The Mondial du Lion cross-country course remains a central highlight of the competition, renowned worldwide for its creativity and worth the trip on its own!

For the 8th consecutive year, the Selle Français Stud Book, the Anglo-Arab Stud Book, Cheval Pays de la Loire, and France Complet have joined forces to present the Young Hopes of Eventing, a championship dedicated to 3-year-old horses in Eventing (CCE) during the Mondial du Lion.

This event aims to identify the best young horses with aptitude for the CCE discipline while highlighting these future performers in a prestigious international setting. The Young Hopes of Eventing also provides breeders with a new sales opportunity for their 3-year-old horses, whether geldings, colts, or fillies, from the Selle Français and Anglo-Arab breeds.

The competition is reserved for the top 20 candidates selected for their predispositions to the discipline, fostering the emer-

Press conference: On Saturday, October 19, and Sunday, October 20, following the events, the top three riders in the standings will be invited to press conferences. These will be held in the Premium Mondial du Lion lodge by the main arena, ensuring proximity to the key participants.

AN ENGAGED EVENT THE MONDIAL RECEIVES THE EXCELLENCE MENTION FROM THE EQUURES LABEL



In 2023, the Mondial du Lion was recognized for its exceptional commitment to the environment, receiving the «Excellence» mention from the EQUURES label. This label evaluates equestrian events based on 130 criteria related to energy management, waste management, transportation, and animal welfare. This distinction, the highest awarded by this national label, establishes the Mondial du Lion as a unique benchmark for ecological responsibility in the world of equestrian competitions.

In 2023.

- 56% of waste was recycled, compared to 50% the previous year. Over six years, the total amount of waste generated by the event has been halved, decreasing from 12 tons in 2018 to 6 tons in 2023.
- This reduction is the result of a collective effort involving volunteers, exhibitors, and service providers, all working towards a common goal of minimizing impacts.

For 2024, the Mondial du Lion plans to conduct a carbon footprint assessment, an essential step to better understand and manage the overall ecological footprint of the competition. This assessment will help identify specific areas for improvement and establish a «low carbon» strategy.

The Mondial du Lion, as a major equestrian sports event attracting over 45,000 spectators, is fully aware of its environmental impact. Reducing this impact is not only a priority but also an opportunity to raise awareness among a wide audience—ranging from competitors to partners—about the importance of adopting more responsible behaviors.

THREE PRIORITY ACTION AREAS:

To address these challenges, the organizers of the Mondial du Lion have defined three essential action areas:

1. Waste Reduction and Sorting:

Numerous collection and sorting stations are set up throughout the venue, supported by volunteers who educate the public on proper sorting practices.

2. Management of Energy and Water Consumption:

Water used for irrigation is sourced from off-network supplies, and sub-irrigation methods significantly reduce water usage. The organization also prioritizes energy-efficient devices and conducts annual energy audits to identify improvement opportunities.

3. Eco-Friendly Transportation Modes:

In partnership with Aléop, free shuttles and a carpooling platform are established to promote sustainable travel and reduce the use of individual vehicles.



ANIMAL WELFARE: A PRIORITY

Animal welfare is another fundamental priority of the event, aligning with our overall commitment to environmental respect. The horses enjoy optimal conditions, with access to spacious paddocks and grazing areas, as well as boxes located in airy, well-lit, and well-ventilated stables. In 2023, we distributed a questionnaire to riders and grooms to gather their feedback on any incidents encountered on site. This information helps identify areas for improvement to ensure a safe and suitable environment for the horses while minimizing negative impacts on their well-being. This year, we are continuing this initiative with an online questionnaire accessible to all.

A MODEL FOR THE FUTURE:

By receiving the «Excellence» mention from the EQUURES label, the Mondial du Lion positions itself as a pioneer, not only in reducing its ecological footprint but also in serving as a model for other equestrian competition organizers. Through these initiatives, we demonstrate that it is possible to reconcile a passion for equestrian sports with respect for the environment.

Acquired by the Department in 1971, the Isle Briand Departmental Park quickly established itself as an emblematic venue for equestrian activities, notably with the establishment of the National Stud. This park has become a true nerve center for the equine sector, attracting enthusiasts and professionals from around the world.

Since 2017, the park has been managed by a Public Interest Group, which has implemented significant improvements. These enhancements aim to facilitate the exploration of the estate while showcasing its natural and cultural heritage. Today, the park is a vibrant place, hosting a variety of entities, including a mounted police unit, SOS Children's Village, the Haras du Lion, as well as organizations dedicated to equestrianism and equestrian tourism: the Lion Racing Association, the Regional Equestrian Committee, the Regional Equestrian Tourism Committee, the French Institute of Horse and Riding, Lion Equestre - Mondial du Lion, and, of course, riders.

Bordered by the Mayenne and Oudon rivers, the park spans over 180 hectares, offering an exceptional natural setting. This vast domain is home to rich biodiversity, with over 140 plant species and 200 animal species, which has earned it the classification as a Sensitive Natural Area. Preserving this environment is a priority, ensuring a harmonious living space for local wildlife and flora.

The park's architecture is equally remarkable, featuring its 18th-century chateau, model farm, and stables designed by Geoffroy de Crépy, architect of the National School of Riding. The park is a true playground for nature lovers, combining heritage, biodiversity, and equestrian passion.

The Isle Briand Departmental Park is thus a unique place where sport, culture, and nature intersect, offering an unforgettable experience to visitors from all walks of life.
